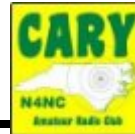




# The Feedline.

Joe White, was first licensed in 1962 as WN4GIR in a small town of Trinity in Piedmont NC. As the then, non-renewable Novice license expired in one year, he became a Technician, WA4GIR, and was mostly active on 6-m using a homemade AM transmitter and ARC-5 receiver with a converter. Over the next few years, his ham radio interests rose and fell, but he maintained the interest in building electronics as a hobby and professionally during a 40+ years at RTI. In 1978, Joe "blundered" into the Extra class ranks when the FCC

was administering exams at the RARS Hamfest. Due to some quirk in the government's ability to levy fees, there was no fee required for licensing, so Joe took the Extra class test just see what the code was like, and unexpectedly passed. However, old timers remember that the CSCE had not been invented at the time so, you had to pass all code and written elements for each class at the same sitting. So, his luck continued with passing of the Advanced and Extra class written tests that day.

Joe's main interests have been in building simple rigs and operating CW. Early rigs included the Knight T-50, Globe Chief, ARC-5 transmitter and receiver, SB100 before upgrading to the KX3. In the mid-80's, Joe signed on as a VE with the RARS VE team and now heads with that team along with his wife, Liz, KO4CK as co-contact VEs. While not an accomplished contester, he enjoys the low-pressure contests such as Field Day and the various QRP contests and sprints. The most notable of these were QRP contests done with fellow KnightLite members including Field Day at Paul (AA4XX) Stroud's farm, Balsam Knob, and Falls Lake; FYBO and the Skeeter sprint at Harris Lake. While not a charter member of the KnightLites, Joe became active in the Club in its early days and participated regularly in the Club activities. He serves as NCS for the weekly 80m KnightLites QRP CW net and along with his wife host the annual fall KnightLites Pig Pickin' at their house.
